

This program is made available through a Jobs In Boating (JIB) grant awarded to Massasoit Community College in partnership with Massachusetts Marine Trades Association (MMTA), Bristol Community College and MY TURN, Inc., through the Massachusetts Executive Office of Labor and Workforce Development.



This 45-hour over-view course introduces participants to careers available in the recreational marine trades with an emphasis on the role of the marine technician. Through lecture, demonstration, hands-on experiences, and field trips, information is gained about opportunities in the following recreation-al marine trade areas: electronics, mechanics, and boatyard skills such as rigging, hull preparation, shrink wrapping, boat transportation, plus marina operations, business office and customer service.

In this course, participants will gain information and some practical skills for a career in the recreational marine trades. Upon successful completion, participants receive a jointly-issued Massasoit Community College/MA. Marine Trades Association, industry-recognized certificate. This credential provides an excellent basis for finding a job in the marine trades, as well as, a great start on the road to Marine Industry Certification!

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### MARINE TECHNICIAN 350-HOUR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Work in an environment you love! Our marine program allows you to work during the day while you train for your new career at night. We have run full programs of twenty students each for the last five years. The 350-Hour Certificate Program involves the three required courses listed below, and runs two evenings a week, plus every second or third Saturday. The next program will start in September 2009 and end in May 2010. CSTT205Marine Technician Fundamentals(140 hours)\$837This course is the first of three modules required to earn the Marine Technician 350-hour Certificate, a program approved by and<br/>offered in partnership with the Massachusetts Marine Trades Association (MMTA). This course provides a brief overview of the<br/>marine industry and working environment for technicians, marine tools and equipment, and safety training. Introduced are the<br/>basic principles of internal combustion engines, engine systems, and basic electricity, plus the theory of power generation. In<br/>addition, fuel, water, steering, electrical, lubrication, ventilation, ignition and instrumentation systems are presented, as well as<br/>basic trouble-shooting for each system. Also covered are Spring preparation and repair, Fall lay-up, trailering, yard equipment,<br/>and basic boat moving and handling. Instruction includes both lecture and hands-on training. The second and third modules: Ma-<br/>rine Technician Outboard Engines and Marine Technician Inboard Engines are offered the following semester.

CSTT206Marine Technician Outboard Engines(96 hours)\$707This course is the second of three modules required to earn the Marine Technician 350-hour Certificate, a program approved by<br/>and offered in partnership with the Massachusetts Marine Trades Association (MMTA). Participants learn the various parts and<br/>processes involved in installation, repair, and maintenance of outboard engines. Included are instructions on the fuel, electrical,<br/>lubrication, and cooling systems of two and four stroke outboards, both carbureted and injected engines. Also covered are lower<br/>units and propulsion, power tilt/ trim, tune-up, trouble-shooting, winterization and preventive maintenance of outboards. Instruc-<br/>tion includes both lecture and hands-on training. Marine Technician Fundamentals is a pre-requisite for this course, and the third<br/>required course, Marine Technician Inboard Engines, will be offered next.

CSTT207Marine Technician Inboard Engines(114 hours)\$717

This course is the third of three modules required to earn the Marine Technician 350-hour Certificate, a program approved by and offered in partnership with the Massachusetts Marine Trades Association (MMTA). Participants learn theory, design, operation, controls, installation, maintenance, and troubleshooting skills for marine inboard, inboard/outboard, stern drive, and diesel engines. The design differences among the engines, as well as their various cooling, lubrication, exhaust, gearing, propulsion, transmission, and hydraulic systems are presented. Instruction includes both lecture and hands-on training. Marine Technician Fundamentals and Marine Technician Outboard Engines are pre-requisites for this course.

This program is made available through a Jobs In Boating Grant awarded to Massasoit Community College in partnership with the Massachusetts Marine Trades Association (MMTA), Bristol Community College and MY TURN, Inc., and the Massachusetts Executive Office for Labor and Workforce Development.



In the summer of 2007 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Executive Office of Labor & Workforce Development formally recognized the critical need to support the competitive growth of the Massachusetts Marine Trades industry. Massasoit Community College in partnership with the Massachusetts Marine Trades Association (MMTA), Bristol Community College and MY TURN, INC. received a grant to increase the number of skilled workers, especially marine technicians, through customized training. The grant focuses on introducing youth, job seekers, returning vets, and incumbent workers to sustainable wage jobs and career ladders. As part of this grant an introductory course, Marine Trades Basic Certificate, was developed by Massasoit Community College in collaboration with MMTA. A similar course, Marine Trades Introduction, was developed by Bristol Community College. Both courses will be offered free for qualified residents in southeastern Massachusetts through June, 2010.

Although not free, higher-level Marine Technician training is available through Massasoit's 350hour Marine Technician Certificate Program and through Bristol Community College's Marine Technology series. During the third year of the grant, advanced training courses will be developed for Marine Technicians and incumbent workers.

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
