## **How to Get There**

**By car:** Plan route in advance because historic Salem is tricky to reach and navigate. The Marina is off Derby Street one block north of the well-publicized *House of Seven Gables*. There's no public parking at the Marina, so you may drop passengers at the corner of Derby & White Streets, then seek legal street parking. Continue on Derby to find free well-signed Festival Parking at the Dominion Power Station (on Fort Avenue, ~10 minute walk). Trailered craft & landside exhibitors enter White Street to unload at the Marina before parking where designated.

**By ferry from Boston:** Take the Salem Ferry's 50-minute trip from Long Wharf/Boston (Aquarium) to arrive next door to the Festival! Four round trips daily on weekends. Tel: 978-741-0220. <http://www.salemferry.com/>

**By public transportation:** It takes ~30 minutes to travel between Salem and Boston by train, and one hour by bus, via MBTA. Rail service is on the Gloucester/Newburyport line out of North Station, Boston. Buses #450 and #455/459 run between Haymarket Square, Boston, and Salem Depot on weekends. For MBTA schedules, call (800) 392-6100 or [www.mbta.com](http://www.mbta.com). The Festival (Brewer Hawthorne Cove Marina) is ~ 3/4 mile from the station. Walk or engage a pedicab.

**By boat ramp:** Continue north down Derby Street past White Street about a mile. Derby Street turns into Fort Avenue. Turn right at sign to *Winter Island Park* and follow the signs to the ramp.

**By sea:** Check coordinates on [Brewer Hawthorne Cove Marina](#). Land address is 10 White Street, Salem MA 01970. Phone 978-740-9890 for reservation. Call VHF Channel 8 as you approach for docking assistance.
